The purpose of the study is to investigate how cardiovascular health, lower body strength, and falling risk responds to 4 weeks of creatine supplementation in older adults. ### Arriving at CSU Bakersfield from WEST via Interstate 5


- Take the Stockdale Highway exit east toward Bakersfield for about 13 miles


