A bounce house was provided, so that even young children of family and friends of CSUB students and alumni were encouraged to attend.

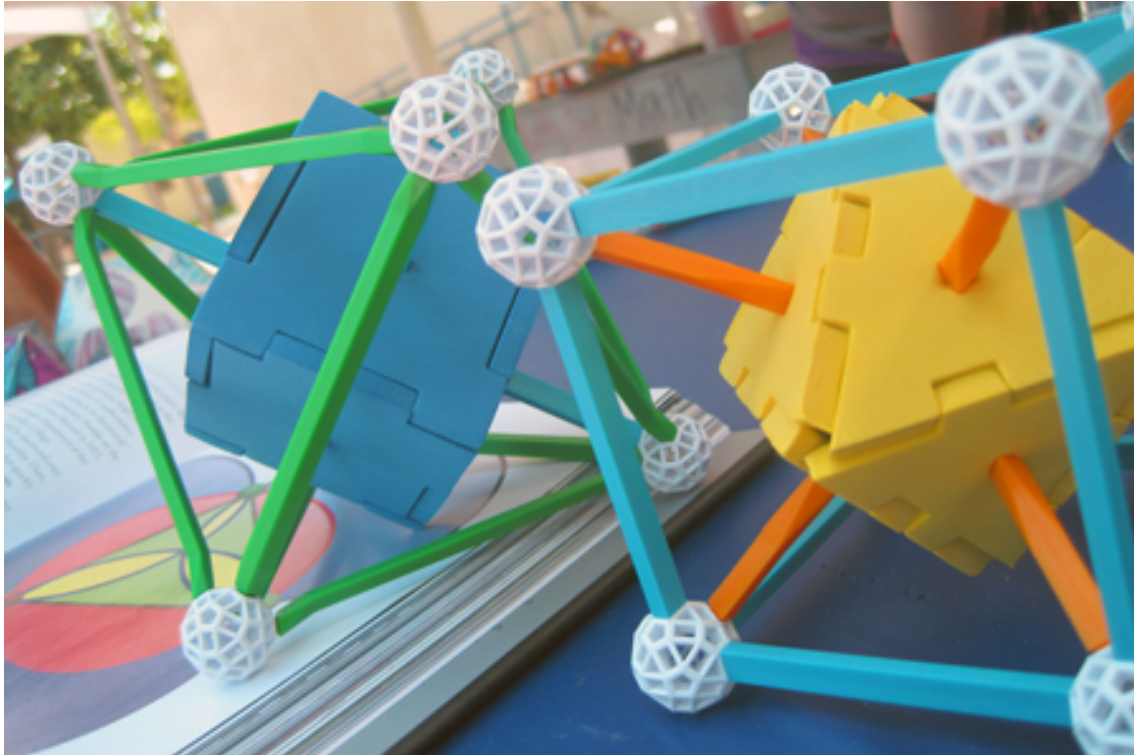
