By 8:00 AM Celebrate CSUB visitors gathered information from the many booths located on the brick road




Students and faculty arrive to Celebrate CSUB and are given information about the various events that are taking place




These were some of the model vases the visitors got to see while deciding if they were interested in attempting to make their own
