

Low student-to-faculty ratio




Three available tracks: 1-year, 2-year, and 3-year




CSUB offers affordable higher education (particularly in comparison to private institutions)



1-Year Track (Advanced-Standing)





- ★ 3 semesters starting in summer
- >>> Summer term is 3 units while fall and spring semesters are 15 units
- 20 hours of practicum per week starting in Fall 2026
- Daytime in person classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays
- Daytime practicum on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays




Fall 2025 1-Year Cohort





2-Year Track (Full-Time)



- 4 semesters starting in the fall
- >>> Fall and spring semesters are 15 units
 - 20 hours of practicum per week starting in Spring 2027
 - Daytime in person classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays
 - Daytime practicum on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays




Fall 2025 2-Year Cohort





3-Year Track (Part-Time)



- 8 semesters starting in the fall
- >>> Fall and spring semesters are 9 units while summer is 3 units
- 20 hours practicum experience per week starting in Spring 2028
- **Evening in person classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays**
- Daytime practicum Monday through Friday

Eligibility Requirements



Accredited bachelor's degree

BSW from CSWE-accredited program earned within the last 5 years required for 1-Year Track



Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.50 (3.00 highly recommended)

Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.00 required for 1-Year Track





Additional requirements for 1-Year Track:

B or better in all social work courses



Application Steps and Materials

Required Materials

- Cal State Apply application to CSUB and MSW Program
- Resume (using our template)
- Employment/volunteer verification letter or form for each experience on your resume
- Two (2) recommendations from academic or professional references (not family or friends)
- 1-Year Track requires one recommendation to be from practicum faculty or supervisor
- MSW writing exam
- Official transcripts

Optional Materials

• The California Title IV-E Education Program Application and supplemental materials are uploaded through Cal State Apply and submitted with the MSW Program application.



MSW Writing Exam Prompts



1. Discuss the academic and/or professional experiences, skills, and attributes that have prepared you for success in graduate school and the social work profession.



2. Discuss your academic and/or professional experiences, skills, attributes, and values that align with the social work profession.



3. Articulate your career goals within the field of social work and how your academic and/or professional background supports those objectives.



4. Describe how you have demonstrated a commitment to social justice or social change in an academic, volunteer, or professional context.



5. Identify specific social work issues or populations that you are most interested in working with and explain why.



6. Explain why you believe the CSUB Department of Social Work is a strong fit for your educational and professional goals.



Your response will be evaluated based on clarity, organization, depth of reflection, and relevance to the field of social work.



Tips for Writing Exam Assessment

Highlight strengths that you believe will make you a good MSW student and future social worker

If your GPA does not reflect your intellectual capability, explain why

Make sure the information presented is concise

Use paragraphs (not numbered)

Write to the prompts

Think about your audience (faculty/admissions committee)

Organize your ideas coherently

Use transition devices to show relationships between ideas

Use standard English

Proofread for spelling and grammatical errors

Financial Aid Overview



Apply for FAFSA or DREAM Act by March 2, 2026, for priority consideration

- Loans and grants available for graduate students



Program stipends available for students pursuing careers in public child welfare or public behavioral health



Look for scholarships through CSUB and external funding sources





California Title IV-E Education Program

Funding Your MSW Education

Empowering MSW Students to Lead in California's Public Child Welfare System

OVERVIEW

What is the California Title IV-E Education
 Program? A collaborative stipend program funded
 by Title IV-E, designed to support MSW students
 committed to careers in public child welfare.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Acceptance into the CSUB MSW Program
- Committed to a career in CA public child welfare
- Must be authorized to work in the U.S.
- Maintain valid CA driver's license and insured vehicle
- Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 during the program

Tuition and cost support for attaining an MSW

Service requirement up to 2 years post-MSW

Formerly known as CalSWEC



CALIFORNIA TITLE IV-E EDUCATION PROGRAM TRACK OPTIONS

Full-Time MSW Students (1 or 2-Year Program)

- Accepted to MSW program
- Concentration Child Welfare classes and Practicum in Child Welfare agency(s)
- \$25,000 per year for up to 2 years (\$12,500 per semester)
- Must not be employed by a public child welfare agency during the program
- One year of public child welfare employment required per year of support

Part-Time MSW Students (3-Year Program)

- Accepted to MSW program
- Must be employed by a California county or tribal social services agency as a public child welfare worker
- Must submit a letter of support from employer
- Reimbursement of up to \$19,141/year for tuition, books, and travel
- Eligible for up to 3 years of support with two years of public child welfare employment required





Public Behavioral Health Training Program

Funding Your MSW Education

Empowering MSW Students to Lead in California's Public Behavioral Health Settings

Public Behavioral Health (PBH) Training Program

- A statewide initiative aimed at preparing MSW students for effective behavioral health care in publicly funded programs, including mental health care, addiction care, and/or interdisciplinary care to clients through a publicly funded agency.
 - **\$25,000**/yr for 1- and 2-year students
 - **\$12,500**/yr for 3-year students
- Disbursements occur in mid- to-late fall & mid-to-late spring
- PBH participants must pay tuition and use the disbursement to reimburse themselves



Additional application materials required.



Practicum in a non-profit placement approved by PBH



Attend mandatory trainings (6-7/semester)



Work 1 year post MSW graduation for each year in the program



Work toward your LCSW after MSW graduation
