Faculty Scholarship and Creative Activity Award

This disease which is caused by a soil-borne fungal pathogen and for which there is no cure, is affecting many residents of Kern County. Education is essential in disease prevention efforts, and Dr. Lauer hopes that her published work and her work in the classroom have made a difference for students and members of the Kern County community. Dr. Lauer's work with the community has recently

led to a new project. This project allows her to use her skills in molecular biology, along with environmental consultants, activists, and students to improve environmental surveys for endangered mammals in Kern County.
